Senator Ellis,

The Charles County Volunteer Firemen's Association respectfully wishes to **SUPPORT** House Bill 0335 and the crossover Senate Bill 0432 in its entirety. As outlined in this legislation, other counties in Maryland have this legislation in place with no issues or violations and we see a strong benefit to adding Charles County to the list the jurisdictions throughout Maryland.

Charles County agritourism farm buildings are already in the existing Public Safety law (Section 12–508), albeit uses under the law are restricted to an occupancy rate of 50 people. SB 432 and HB 335 simply seek to increase the occupancy rate to 200 people while exempting the existing structures from expensive upgrades required by the state's building standards.

We did reach out to the Office of the State Fire Marshal to ensure fire codes were to be followed and agree with them to support this legislation. Should you have any other concerns or questions, please reach out at your convenience.
